<u>2021 DOG LICENSES:</u> All dogs 7 months or older are to be licensed each year. The 2021 Dog Licenses can be purchased at the Municipal Building between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday in the Municipal Clerk's Office, Room 105. You may also mail your fee along with proof of rabies and neutering/spaying to 470 Stage Coach Road, Millstone Twp., NJ 08510. Neutered/Spayed dog fee is \$12.00 and Non-Neutered/Non-Spayed dog fee is \$15.00. A late fee of \$10.00 PER DOG goes into effect May 1st for all residents who have not renewed their dog's license for the current year. No Cash Payments. Checks or money orders are accepted.

MONMOUTH COUNTY PROUD TO BE STIGMA-FREE

The Monmouth County **Stigma-Free Initiative** is a county-wide program that aims to reduce the negative beliefs associated with mental illness and behavioral health disorders, including substance use. This initiative is dedicated to raising awareness of the disease of mental illness and substance use disorder to create a culture wherein residents feel supported by their community and neighbors and feel free to seek treatment for the diseases without fear of being outcast.


When an individual is labelled by their illness they experience stigma and prejudice. Stigma brings experiences and feelings of shame, embarrassment,

distress, hopelessness and reluctance to seek or accept help. As a result, it is one of the primary reasons individuals do not seek help when they experience symptoms of mental illness.

Other reasons frequently cited are shame and fear of judgment from friends, family and co-workers. Such judgment is often rooted in a lack of knowledge, understanding or education.

The Millstone Alliance to Prevent Substance Abuse is working with the Monmouth County Stigma-Free Initiative to encourage interest, awareness and open dialogues about stigma and to foster a stigma-free community environment where people are free from judgment and can get the help they need to recover from disease. The County of Monmouth and several Monmouth County towns, including Millstone Township, have already passed Stigma-Free resolutions, but passing this resolution is just the first step. Working together with community groups, we will work to provide education and resources and promote inclusion and acceptance.

It is appropriate that we kick off this initiative during May, which has been dedicated as Mental Health Awareness Month, in the hope of reducing the stigma so many experience. We will also be highlighting some incredible work already being done in our community by people who believe there is no health without mental health. DID YOU KNOW?

Many times residents concerned with the environment want to recycle properly. However, items such as window glass, plastics that hold personal hygiene products, or other products that manufacturers print with the "recycling triangle", can't be recycled. Placing even a small amount of these items in our recyclables can cause the entire truck load to be rejected. When this occurs the truck is sent to the landfill and none of it is recycled. This is the leading reason recycling costs are going up. PLEASE HELP US KEEP MILLSTONE TOWNSHIP GREEN AND CLEAN DON'T PLACE ITEMS NOT ON THE RECYCLING LIST IN YOU RECYCLING.
