

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE TOWNSHIP CLERK'S OFFICE:

2025 DOG LICENSES: All dogs 7 months or older are to be licensed each year. The 2025 Dog Licenses can be purchased at the Municipal Building between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday in the Municipal Clerk's Office, Room 105 starting January 2, 2025. Pet license applications and renewals are accepted online through the GovPilot portal (see page 2) or mail your fee along with proof of rabies and neutering/spaying to 470 Stage Coach Road, Millstone Twp., NJ 08510. Neutered/Spayed dog fee is \$12.00 and Non-Neutered/Non-Spayed dog fee is \$15.00. A late fee of \$10.00 PER DOG goes into effect May 1, 2025 for all residents who have not renewed their dog's license for the current year.

All residents will separate newspapers, glass bottles and jars, tin and bi-metal cans, plastic containers, aluminum cans, corrugated cardboard for collection and ultimate recycling of materials.


Curbside Recycling Guidelines:

Many times residents concerned with the environment want to recycle properly. However, items such as window glass, plastics that hold personal hygiene products, or other products that manufacturers print with the "recycling triangle", can't be recycled. Placing even a small amount of these items in our recyclables can cause the entire truck load to be rejected. When this occurs the truck is sent to the landfill and none of it is recycled. This is the leading reason recycling costs are going up.

Stars and Stripes Ag Fair





The Thomas Baird Homestead was once again the site where families from five states gathered on June 30, 2024 to exhibit their animals. Kicking off the New Jersey Ag Fair season, this fair is free to the public and gives them a glimpse into the world of farming.

For 23 years, this event has offered exhibits on current research on managing crops and livestock. Youth are given feedback on their animals while they get a chance to demonstrate how well they trained them. No child is too old or young to participate. Two three-year old cousins from Delaware entered the ring together with their lambs to compete for the blue ribbon. Meanwhile, Millstone resident Kindergartener, Nuzi Bertolino was answering poultry questions, as she showed her pet hen to our Poultry Judge, Fred

Wiedau who also resides in Millstone. Another hometown girl, Elizabeth Mooney was running from the Dairy Goat ring to the rabbit table. In all, 98 cattle, sheep, goats, chickens, donkeys, mini horses, rabbits, guinea pigs competed along with a corn snake and a gecko. 244 youth age 3 to 21 competed.

This year, a new event was added – Showman for a Day. Youth with physical, mental and social challenges were welcomed to try their hand at showing an animal. As far as we know, there is no other event like this in the United States. We hope that more will crop up as the magic that an animal can provide all children is given the attention that it deserves. The History of the Historic Calendars and why Friends need your help!



It all started way back in the year of 2000 when the Historic Commission printed the first of four calendars to share the vast history of our Township with the community. In 2016 we, the Friends of Millstone Township Historic Registered Properties, brought back the same idea, this time using this avenue to introduce ourselves, for those who don't know us, and use this much needed platform as a fundraiser.

We love creating the calendar, and everyone looks forward to getting it every year, but have you ever given it a thought to the work that goes into making it?

The Township Historian starts in January (no exaggeration) of each year researching the towns past. A great deal of hours, that includes interviews, state and county archival deposits, libraries, newspapers, and researching the internet, tracking down photos and stories.

The calendar itself takes 40 plus hours on the computer designing, creating the ads and contents and traveling the Township, visiting businesses for their support. We rely on our sponsors to help deflect the cost of printing. The list of steps it takes to produce the calendar are many. It's hard work, many hands, miles, time, and gas all done by volunteers.

The reality is all the calendars we created over the years, we received only one most appreciated \$25 dollar donation! Please community, we could use some help. A donation, or few hours of volunteering, would go a long way.

Right now, we need a *volunteer* to manage our website. <u>savinghistorywithfriends.org</u>. This person needs to have a strong knowledge of computer technology. Along with the mechanical side, we also need someone that has the technical knowledge. Some duties would be maintenance of the site work, site contents, blogs content, creating buttons, visual effects, links, QR codes and photos. For an experienced person this might be 15 minutes a month.

The Friends of Millstone Township is a 501c3 non-profit organization dedicated to the furthering of public interest in the conservation, preservation, and appreciation of the history of Millstone Township and Monmouth County. It provides the community with educational activities, exhibitions, and hands-on programs. The restoration and care of our historic properties in the Township takes great effort and extensive fundraising. We can only achieve our goals with volunteers and donations from members of the community. Although these are township-owned properties, we are responsible for utility bills and program costs.
